Arrest and charges laid in Operation Lota



In late July, a senior manager of a renewable energy technology company was arrested and charged over allegedly attempting to bribe a Commonwealth public official during a product approval process.

It is alleged the man attempted to bribe the public official with \$20,000 in cash. He has been charged with offering a secret commission to an agent, under section 442BA of the *Queensland Criminal Code 1899*.

The arrest and charges stem from Operation Lota, a joint investigation by the Queensland Police Service, the NACC and the Australian Federal Police.

Updated Strategic Corruption Priorities

We have updated our Strategic Corruption Priorities, which are thematic issues we use to focus our work exposing and preventing corrupt conduct. They assist our decision-making (including prioritisation) regarding referrals we receive, drive proactive work, promote collaboration with other agencies, and improve transparency.

The updated priorities closely reflect the previous priorities, with minor changes to their titles and definitions.

The 6 priorities are:

- Corrupt conduct affecting vulnerable people
- Corrupt conduct at the Australian border
- Corrupt conduct involving senior public officials
- Corrupt conduct involving contractors
- Corrupt conduct in procurement and grants
- Corrupt conduct affecting the environmental sector

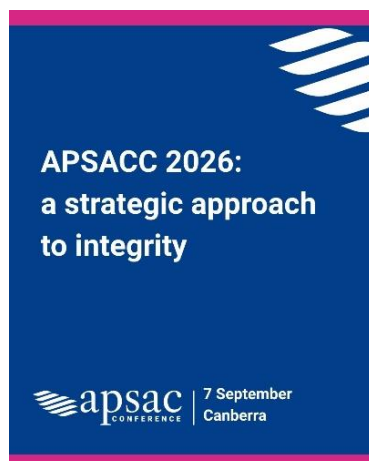


Last chance to register for APSACC
